This has been a year of growth; of seeing some of our dreams go and others be born, of trusting more and being able to do some things even better of discovering our vulnerability and discovering that from there comes even greater strength. El Pozo de Vida now has 7 different projects fighting against human trafficking in the areas of prevention, intervention, and restoration. We now have 42 members of staff and our efforts have extended beyond Mexico City reaching up to 5 different states across the country.

At the end of last year we were selected by the Mexican Federal Government to represent the efforts of NGO's fighting against human trafficking at a forum in Washington, D.C. with other organizations representing the United States and Canada. It was a great honor to receive this recognition for our work.

This year we will begin two new projects. The first will offer vocational training to women coming out of prostitution and the second is establishing a justice school to train a new generation of freedom fighters in Brazil.

However growing has not been easy. It is a challenging and sometimes painful process that is full of continuous learning. And as we look back at all that we have experienced, we are filled with great hope for the future. There is still a great deal to be done to complete this mission, but each small accomplishment allows us to see that God goes ahead of us in this path.

### MISSION

El Pozo de Vida fights against human trafficking through prevention, intervention, and restoration of children, families, and communities; for them to be free, healthy, and build a life project.

### VISION

In 2021 El Pozo de Vida aims:

- To be a recognized and expert organization in the areas in which it works. And to transform the commercial system, demand and justice in human trafficking.
- To be established as an economically stable organization.
- To have a healthy and trained team.
- For our survivors to attain a higher level of education, have a defined and implemented life project.
- For our survivors to be emotionally stable, physically healthy and make assertive decisions.
- For the families and communities to be conscious of the damage that can be done within human trafficking and for them to not discriminate nor revictimize the survivors.
- To influence the way Mexico's justice system functions and that it fairly judges traffickers and consumers of human trafficking.
- That the system will fight for the victims and their reintegration.
- That there will be a change in the perception of society that the fault is not of the victims and that women are not seen as sexual objects.

### HOW WE BRING FREEDOM



### Prevention

If we can attend to the root of the problem we can prevent it from getting worse in a few years. This is why we spend a great deal of our efforts on sharing valuable information with the youth of this generation, so that they do not become future victims or pimps and at the same time create awareness on them so they do not become consumers.



### Intervention

It is necessary to go where the victims are. We cannot expect them to become free if we do not break the chains that they are bound to. For this reason we go to the streets, the plazas, migration centers and the dark places, to meet the victims where they are and in doing so give them a new option for life.



### Restoration

To bring freedom is the first step, but there is a long way to go before finding restoration. The healing of their hearts, restoring their hope and renewing their spirit are all part of a process that requires trustworthy and loving people to walk with them, listen to them, give them structure and above all else, love the survivors.



Young people are a group of especially vulnerable people and for this reason we have developed the informative kit in partnership with other organizations and the local government of Mexico City. It is specifically designed for schools in the public system which has an informative flyer and three internationally recognized documentary videos. In the first year, there were 35,000 copies distributed in middle schools across the delegation Cuauhtemoc, one of the areas with the most human trafficking in Mexico City.

1A1 seeks to educate, create awareness and prevent human trafficking in different sectors of our society with a particular emphasis towards young people, being that they are very vulnerable to become victims of this crime. One of the most efficient forms of establishing contact with this group of people is through schools.





Since 2016, we have used technology to make people aware of the situation of human trafficking on an international level through the AWAKE VR Experience. This is a series of videos in virtual reality where several different victims share their testimonies.

In collaboration with Independence Studios, Operation Blessing International and Operation Blessing Mexico, we facilitate a program called the AWAKE VR Experience in different places to bring awareness. The objective is to connect the participants with the victims and in that way, they can hear the voices of those that have been knocked down. They are introduced to the people and their experiences in order to know the stories of those that were once invisible.

más que el año anterior One of the main red light districts in Latin America is in La Merced. This area has turned into one of the most important points in the city where sexual exploitation of minors occurs.

This intervention project utilizes a community center to provide workshops, trainings, therapy, and spiritual accompaniment to women in prostitution and in that way extend to them the opportunity of a new life.

In this center there are individual and group therapy sessions, counseling, provided meals, education, training in searching for a job and the opportunity to build a supportive relationship with the staff. The center is now known as a safe place for the women, empowering them within a harmonious and warm environment.



WE AIM TO PROVIDE ATTENTION, ORIENTATION AND ACCOMPANIMENT TO VICTIMS AND POTENTIAL VICTIMS OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING WITHIN THE MIGRANT STATIONS OF MEXICO.











The objective of the safe house in EPDV is to fill the lives of the rescued girls with hope and light. These girls were victims of trafficking with the explicit purpose of sexual and labor exploitation. In many cases, these girls were classified by the government or by other homes as in high risk or high demand cases.

The victims receive holistic care including: medical care, education, social skills, individual and family therapy, spiritual counseling and legal guidance.

This year, with the help of all of our donors, we were able to purchase a property to establish a home to offer these girls their own space so that they may say, "this is my home." It's a more comfortable place, spacious, that permits better development and a greater quality of life.

What happens to a girl from the safe house when she is of legal adult age? In 2014, we opened the first transition home in Latin America.

The house is open to survivors over the age of 18 that need support to start and live an independent life. They come into the house by their own free will and have the option to stay 3-24 months while they look for job alternatives, enter a study program, and save money to start their new life.



In may of 2014, the Transition Home opened its doors to the first survivors coming out of the safe house using a Biopsychosocial Attention Model. This is run from two perspectives:

A general process for treatment and attention. The idea is to extend worthy and safe asylum, emotional and spiritual support, recreation and access to medical services; accompaniment in the process of social reintegration and the forming of social tools. Also learning how to manage the support systems and family links.

An individualized and integral attention plan. Considering that each one of the survivors has different issues and needs, each case is taken on in a personalized manner, including medical treatment, psychological treatment, psychiatric care, education, and work training.

Nunayu is an economic project of women in search of new dreams.

The first generation of women were 8 in total and work in jewelry design and manufacturing.





They also are offered workshops in art therapy, nutrition, english, zumba (taught by one of our girls), bible studies, counseling and social service.

Nunayu was birthed in March of 2015 as a project of micro business to give the option of alternative work for women in search of new dreams.

We focus on this section of society as these women were trapped in the industry for 10, 20 or even 30 years, at a time when human trafficking was only a myth.

Nunayu was designed to give work to these girls that due to lack of opportunities or experience in some work trade, find themselves without the power to advance to other industries of work.


